### **Enjoy A Piece of History - Now for Sale**

Are you puzzled about what you want to see on vacation? Well if you put the pieces together, the puzzle is solved – the Flack Barn in Macomb, Illinois is one of the places to see. The Macomb Area Convention Bureau announces they will be selling 500 piece puzzles of the historical Flack Barn.

The Flack Barn is proudly owned by Chick and Jo Flack and farmed by Debi and Dean Reubush. The double valley cross-gable barn was built in 1900 and has been in the same family for 140 years. The original owner and great grandfather of the current owner lived on the farm until 1911. The complete exterior has been restored and the colors of the barn maintain the historical sense of time. One unique advantage of the barn is the freestanding roof that leaves the hayloft free of posts and beams. Windows on three sides light the hayloft and louvers on all four sides provide ventilation.

Seniors will love this puzzle that shows off the rural beauty of historical McDonough County. This puzzle will bring together families and friends and teens will even be challenged as they put the pieces together of McDonough County history.

This one of a kind barn is located near the heart of Macomb in McDonough County, Illinois where the beauty of rural life is celebrated.
